NASA has just announced a schedule of events to commemorate the achievements of the Apollo program and the 40th anniversary of the first lunar landing. Among the activities is a news conference with astronauts from several Apollo missions scheduled from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m. (EDT) on July 20, 2009.
