Program	Description	Deadline
Iraqi Young Leaders Exchange Program (IYLEP)	This program is part of a 2006 Presidential Initiative. It was announced by President Bush in agreement with Prime Minister Nouri Al-Maliki during a visit of the Prime Minister to the White House. It is a one-month scholarship program for high school students and university students to participate in leadership development and civic education.	Mid January
MEPI - Student Leaders Program	Five-week long summer program for university students. Participants from 18 countries in the Middle East will be assigned to one of six host universities in the U.S. The main focus of the program is leadership.	Mid January
Study of the United States Institutes (SUSI)	Six week intensive post-graduate level academic summer programs with integrated study tours for foreign university faculty and scholars to deepen their understanding of American society, culture and institutions. The goal is to strengthen curricula and to improve the quality of teaching about the United States in academic institutions abroad.	Mid January
International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP)	Two to three week programs for mid-professionals identified by the Mission as potential leaders to meet and confer with their professional counterparts in their field and to experience America firsthand. Note: The Embassy selects candidates for this program	Late April / Early May
Fulbright Visiting Specialists Program: Direct Access to the Muslim World	For scholars and practitioners from the Muslim World to spend 3-6 weeks at a U.S. college lecturing and conducting public outreach on topics related to Islamic society and civilization.	Mid May
Fulbright Student Program	Two-year Master's degree study program in the U.S. all fields except Medicine; for 2010 GOI matching our funds and doubling this Fulbright program.	Late May
International Fulbright Science and Technology Award	Doctoral study at prestigious U.S. institutions in science, technology, or engineering for up to 40 outstanding foreign students worldwide.	Late May
Humphrey Fellowship	Non-degree, one-year program for study,	Early August

MEPI – Leaders for Democracy Fellowship Program	Six –week academic course for young (25-40 yrs old) democratic reform leaders from the Middle East and North Africa to complete both academic coursework and a practical, skill-building experience in their field of choice in the U.S. Applicants should have capacity to apply the opportunities presented by the fellowship in a way that would benefit an organization, sector, or specific community.	Early November
MEPI: Women in Business and Law Internship Program	A month at UPenn Law or Wharton then internship in a U.S. law firm or business.	November
Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant Program (FLTA)	Nine-month, non-degree program for English language teachers to serve as assistant teachers of Arabic at U.S universities or high schools and take graduate courses related to their career in English language teaching.	changing to same schedule as Fulbright Student Program for Academic year 2010: May 2009
MEPI - Tomorrow's Leaders Scholarship Program	New MEPI initiative for high school seniors in the Middle East who are from underserved backgrounds. The program will provide four-year university scholarships at select institutions of higher learning in the Middle East (American University of Beirut and Lebanese American University).	Late December / Early January
Iraq Women in Engineering and Applied Sciences (IWASE)	Sponsored by the Iraq Women's Fellowship Foundation and funded by Embassy Baghdad, this fellowship allows women with doctoral degrees to spend an academic year at an American university; include pre-program English language training.	December
MEPI Civic Education and Leadership Fellowship (CELF)	CELF provides up to 60 university teachers and scholars an opportunity to participate in individually tailored 5 month programs at the Maxwell School for Public Affairs at Syracuse University. The objective is to enhance international standards in social science education through improved curricula development and course delivery, increased institutional capacity, expanded student and faculty engagement; and improved critical thinking and analytic capabilities of educators in institutions of higher education. Candidates should work at an accredited institution of higher education in social science disciplines, including political science, public administration, law, media, journalism, and communications. English language skills required.	December
